

## Conflict Minerals Statement

Celsia Inc. is committed to responsible sourcing practices and compliance with the requirements of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act and the associated regulations issued by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) regarding Conflict Minerals.

"Conflict Minerals" refers to tin, tungsten, tantalum, and gold (commonly known as 3TG), regardless of their country of origin. This law specifically addresses concerns that trade in these minerals may be financing armed conflict and human rights abuses, particularly in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and adjoining countries.

Celsia does not directly source conflict minerals from mines or smelters. However, as part of our supply chain due diligence:

- We require our suppliers to disclose the use and origin of 3TG minerals in the materials they provide.
- We expect suppliers to source materials from smelters and refiners that are certified as Conflict-Free by recognized programs, such as the Responsible Minerals Assurance Process (RMAP).
- We conduct a Reasonable Country of Origin Inquiry (RCOI) in accordance with SEC guidelines, utilizing supplier surveys and third-party data where applicable.

Based on the information provided by our suppliers, Celsia products, including all custom heat sinks and related components, are designed and manufactured in a manner intended to be "DRC Conflict-Free" as defined by the SEC.

### Celsia's Conflict Minerals Commitment

- Promote awareness of conflict minerals issues across our supply base.
- Work with suppliers to ensure sourcing practices support responsible mineral procurement.
- Provide customers with appropriate conflict minerals reporting upon request (e.g., CMRT — Conflict Minerals Reporting Template).

We continue to monitor the evolving regulatory environment and will update our practices accordingly to maintain full compliance.
